Dear Mr. James,

Thank you for your letter of the 30th November. Whilst I note and understand the concerns you feel about the likely outcome of the Scott Inquiry, I am afraid that I do not have the resources available to my Committee to try to second-guess what the Judge may find. If, as you say, you have letters establishing that Gornall Ba' was being threaten by the Foreign Office and was involved with the M.O.D. in the Northern Ireland office some six months before his murder, I hope very much that you will make these available to the Scott Inquiry so that this aspect of the whole affair can be fully and properly explored.

I am more than grateful to you for your kind remarks in your closing paragraphs. I can assure you that I and the Defence Committee will do what we can to secure the future of our national defences and to prevent the re-occurrence of any of the underhand methods of policy making which clearly led you and your company, together with many others, to disaster.
